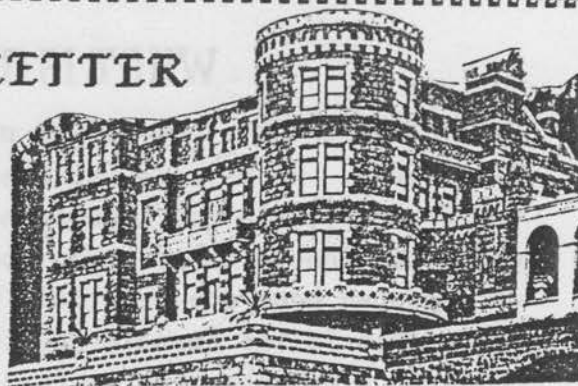

Tuesday. The date on the left of the page is the date of the paper in
which the marriage appears. There was not a marriage published in
every issue of the paper. Papers missing are from October 26, 1806 to
February 17, 1807.
