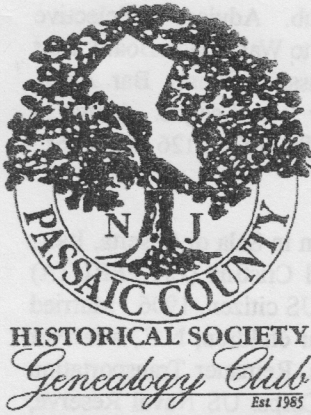

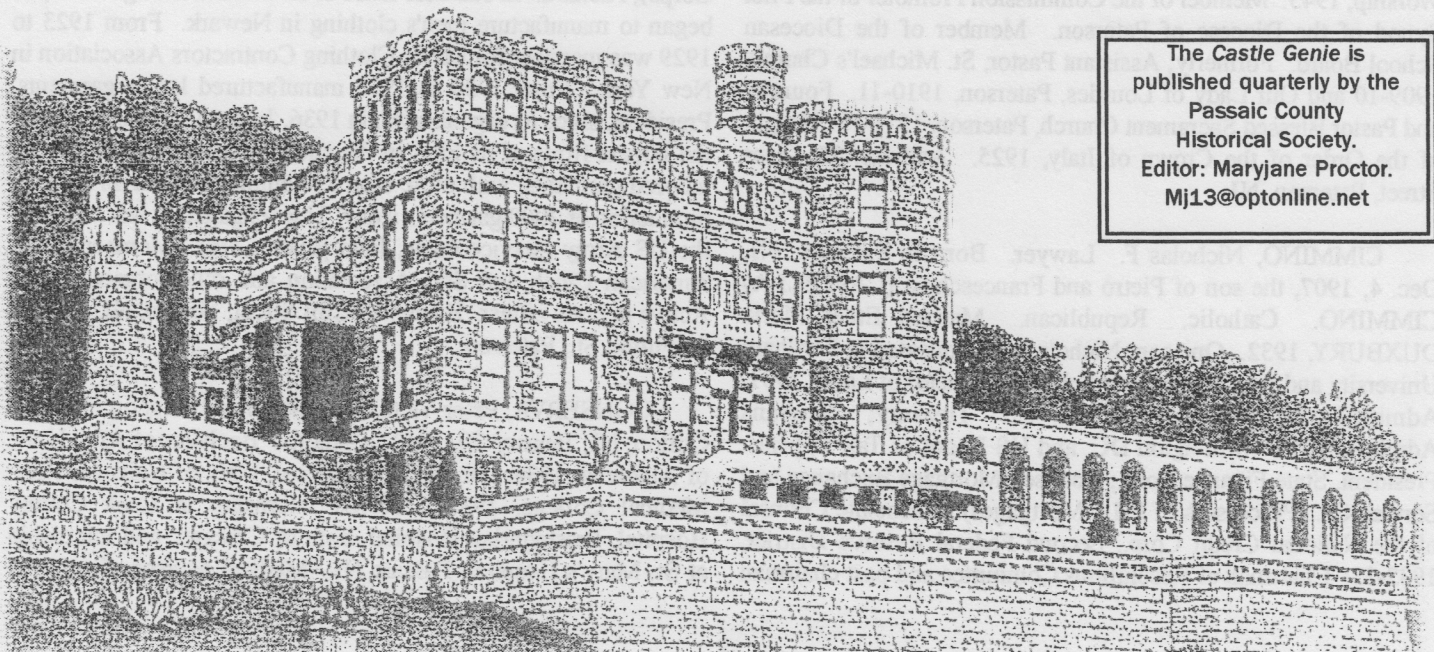
## ITALIAN-AMERICAN WHO'S WHO, 1943 LISTS MANY DISTINGUISHED PASSAIC COUNTY RESIDENTS

The Passaic County residents listed below have been extracted from the 1943 Edition (Volume VIII) of the "Italian-American Who's Who," published by Vigo Press, NYC. This large volume is a "biographical dictionary of Italian-American leaders and distinguished Italian residents across the United States and the Dominion of Canada."

The directory can be a very valuable genealogical tool, as in most cases it contains occupation, date and place of birth, parents (with mothers maiden name), year immigrated and naturalized (if applicable), spouse (with maiden name and year married), religion, political affiliation, memberships, and business and home addresses. My maternal grandfather Joseph DAMATO, a self-made Paterson businessman, was listed in this 1943 edition. ~ Maryjane Proctor ~

BELLOMO, Joseph. Architect. Born in San Cataldo, Caltanissetta, Italy, May 28, 1884. In America since 1906. US citizen, 1919. Married Grace DE ROSA, 1920. Catholic. Democrat. Admitted to practice architecture in New Jersey, 1921. BERTONI, Louis P. Judge and lawyer. Born in Clifton, NJ, February 6, 1909. Catholic. Republican. Married Esther GIACOMINI, 1938. Educated at Seton Hall Preparatory School, So. Orange, NJ; McKenzie Prep School, Monroe NY (gr. 1928); Lafayette College, 1928; Catholic Univ. B.A. 1932; John Marshall College of Law, L.L.B., 1935. Judge of the Police Court since 1942. Member of NJ House of Assembly 1940; Member of Clifton City Council since 1938; Director East Clifton Building and Loan Assn. Solicitor for American Building and Loan Assn, Garfield NJ. Member: Clifton Passaic County and NJ State Bar Assoc.; Elks; Moose; Passaic County Republican League, etc. Sponsored the Weasel Brook Flood Project, Clifton NJ. CANGER, Thomas. General contractor. Born in Paterson, NJ, February 21, 1903, the son of Michael and Chiara (CORTESE) CANGER from Sala Consilina, Salerno, Italy. Catholic. Married Marguerite THOMPSON, 1941. Educated at Paterson High School, (gr. 1921); Lafayette College, Easton, Pa (Civil Engineering) 1922, and Moravian College, Bethlehem, Pa. 1923. Of a family of contractors (his father who came to America in 1899 was the first Italian excavating contractor in the City of Paterson and the first to use a steam shovel). Mr. Canger in 1925 joined the Canger Construction Company of which he became president later. In 1937, however, he established his present firm, The Canger Contracting Co., Excavators. Associate member of the Passaic County Engineering Society. Member of the Manufacturers Association of NJ; Paterson Panthers, etc. Active in civic affairs and charitable movements. Formerly; Assistant Pastor, St. Michael's Church, 1909-10 and Our Lady of Lourdes, Paterson, 1910-11. Founder and Pastor Blessed Sacrament Church, Paterson, 1911-19. (Processors of FHA Mortgages). Associate Counsel of the National Credit Corp., Second Federal Reserve District, 1932-33. Chairman of Resolutions Committee and past chairman

Started as messenger boy with German-American Trust Company, now US Trust Company of Paterson NJ, rising to his present position of Vice Pres. Health Commissioner, 1914-1920. Commissioner of Public Works, 1922-1924. President, Purchasing Comm City of Paterson, 1923-24. President, Paterson Clearing House Association, 1931-1933. Vice Pres, Peoples Park Bank, Siderside Trust Company, United Bankers Title and Mortgage Guarantee Co. President Beno Cooperation. Director of several other corporations. Secretary and Treas. National Credit Corporation, Second Federal Reserve District, No. 13; Past Vice-chairman NRA for Paterson and vicinity. From 1930 to 1936 manufactured ladies garments. President, since its organization in 1936, Jersey Coat Company, of the largest firms of its kind in the country, specializing in ladies tailored garments, with more than 750 employees and an average production of 2000 garments a day. Average annual volume of business \$200,000. President since

1940, Florida Realty Co., Real Estate operators. Established himself in business after working for two years for another concern and soon developed his firm, making it today one of the largest in Passaic County. Educated at the technical school and Liceo of Como. For three years studied industrial chemistry and silk dyeing in Italy, working as an interchange student in various plants in Como and vicinity. Editor, since 1934 "La Miamma" monthly bulletin of the New Jersey Grand Lodge of the Order Sons of Italy. Knight, Order of the Crown of Italy. 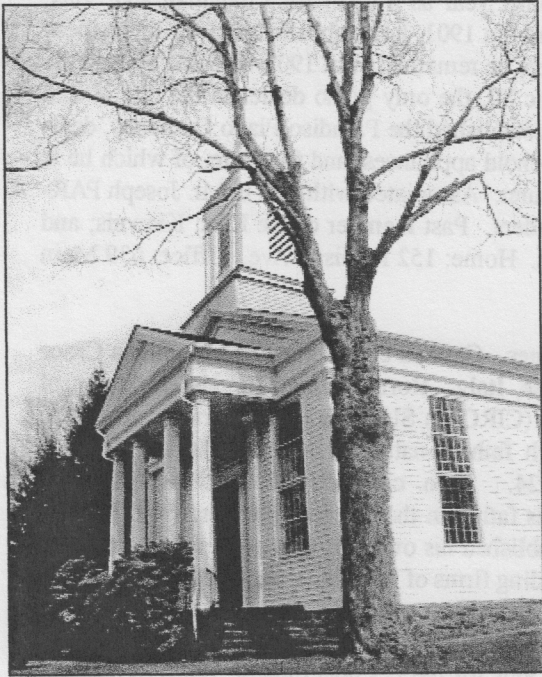

It was in the autumn of 1904 that Philmer EVES conceived the plan of a club that should have for its sole object, the arrangement of walks and rambles for the purpose of recreation and for studying the native flowers, shrubs and trees, the geology, ornithology, entomology, and all the other wonders of the outdoors.

On Saturday, September 24th, 1904 when by the kind invitation of Catholina Lambert, the owner of "Belle Vista," the Club visited the castle on Garret Mountain. Mr. Lambert personally met the party and conducted them through the Italian gardens and afterwards through the picture galleries and private rooms of the mansion, describing the art treasures and curiosities of his vast and magnificent collection. At his invitation, the Club members joined in singing the "Ode of Welcome," and a copy was presented to Mr. Lambert as a poetic symbol of the Club's appreciation and gratitude for the great privilege extended to the Club. Paterson and its vicinity had features of marked beauty in its hills and mountains and undulating valleys. The Paterson Rambling Club was purposely organized to inspire and promote interest in the beauties of the Passaic Valley.

Being an ardent lover of nature, Eves realized the advantages that Paterson surroundings possessed in this respect and felt sure that there was much more than sufficient material at hand to keep such an organization alive permanently. He established The Rambling Club on January 3, 1908.

## THE OLD ORCHARD FARM PREAKNESS, NEW JERSEY 1905

Philmer Eves  
 November 1931

The peculiarly interesting and charming subject of this short sketch is Mrs. Louiza Hall of Orchard Farm, on the Hamburg Avenue Turnpike, Preakness (Wayne). This worthy lady, with her lovable and chatty disposition was known to so many people that it seems a matter of no little surprise that her attractive history has not been published before.

It is to be regretted that a fuller account than this brief story has not been given of the life and reminiscences of one whose beautiful and amiable character was familiar to such a wide circle of Paterson and Haledon friends.

It was the privilege of the writer to pay a visit to the kindly old lady on Easter morning in 1905. The cordial welcome and the evident pleasure at receiving an early call on so lovely a spring day, seemed to invite a favorable and pleasant opportunity to recall events of the past and to indulge in a reverie, as it were, of by-gone memories. A cheery smile and a conscientious and evident realization of a righteous life characterized all the good lady's delightfully interesting conversation.

Her recollections of earlier days and stories of prominent people whom she had known were enhanced by a remarkably retentive memory and a surprising sweetness of choice expression. Mrs. Hall was a remarkable personage. It is often that

we are privileged to meet with one so gifted and so full of rare and entertaining information.

If a bright and intelligent eye, an ever-present cheerfulness and a pink bloom of health on dimpled cheeks are a sign of youth, Mrs. Hall must be considered quite young. The rosy cheeks, especially, have been the envy of many a maiden who had looked upon them with a perplexed delight. Yet we had the assurance of Louiza Hall herself that she was born on March 14th, 1829. Hence, her years had exceeded by six, the allotted three score years and ten. Her mother belonged originally to the ancient town of Taunton, England, but Mrs. Hall was born at Hackney, near London, within sight of "Old London Bridge." Her father was in good circumstances there and was celebrated in that section of London for his eight unusually fine and handsome daughters. A charming story about these daughters was told to the writer by Mrs. Hall, who was herself one of the eight pretty maidens. In those days, and indeed down to the present time, the time honored May Day crowning of the "Queen of the May" was celebrated every year. One of the accompaniments of the lovely old custom, was fun and frolics of the young men known as "stilties" who, mounted on long stilts, joined in this parade and thus formed part of the gay and merry sport and escort of the "May Queen" to her

throne out on the hearth. These gay young Lotharios, knowing the reputed loveliness of the eight damsels, and out for a little gallant and innocent amusement, were discovered by the maidens stern and righteous old father as they were peeping, from their high eminence on the stilts, though one of the upper windows of the house. Mrs. Hall recalled the romantic occurrence vividly, and it was really delightful to hear her own graphic and authentic account of it. In those days, she had cousins who went to school with the young Princess Victoria, who afterwards became Queen of England, and Mrs. Hall related with a fond remembrance how when "the good Queen" became the bride of the Prince Consort, a piece of the wedding cake was placed in a small silver box and sent to her in this country. This royal wedding cake was made by a "Purveyor to the Queen" named Tringham of London, who was a personal friend of the Gannett family, of which old family the attractive subject of these lines was one of the descendants.

Louiza Hall came to America when about six years old and had resided here ever since. Married at an early age, she had quite a large family. In addition to four sons who had died, there were, at the time of our interview, four hearty sons living. Of the surviving sons "two were married and two single; two were carpenters and two

had no trade; two were musical and musicians and two were not musical at all" a remarkable combination of pairs. One son resided in the picturesque valley on the Pompton Road, immediately below the farm while Ralph managed the farm and stayed at home with his mother. Ralph was always interesting. It was a real treat to get out with him in the fields and woods and to listen to his quaint sayings and to pick up valuable lore which he could impart relating to the flowers, trees, insects, and birds of the beautiful and sylvan neighborhood. This son, Ralph, met with a sad end, recently in an accident on River Street, Paterson.

The old wooden, weatherworn homestead itself stands just inside Wayne Township, while the adjoining barns are in the Township of Manchester. This district was known in Mrs. Hall's early days of the Township of Saddle River. The land extended to within the cedar woods and contained pasturage, gardens, meadows, and a very fine orchard. The estate was bought by an uncle of Mrs. Hall from General Godwin nearly a century before the

time when this little history was written. The orchard, by the way, was famous for its apple trees, some of which contained as many as ten different varieties or graftings on the one trunk. It was this orchard that produced the apples of enormous size presented to the Paterson Rambling Club and exhibited in the store of Piaget & Co. in the autumn of 1904. Along the roadside, in front of the house, was a "a well known well" of sparkling spring water which had so often relieved the thirst of pedestrians and travelers. It was formerly a bubbling spring but when the level of the road was raised, a well and pump had to be substituted for the running spring. Here, alongside the perennial spring, the aged lady had lived her sweet and blameless life, communing with nature and doing good to those around her. At our delightful interview, Mrs. Hall said she had been married "sixty-one years ago last January" and spoke

affectionately and proudly of her honored ancestors, whose history she said she knew as she did "an oak tree from acorn to coffin." Among her treasures were some fine antique pictures and photographs of the ancestors. The most remarkably well-preserved of the photographs was a colored miniature of her grandfather which showed quaint and gallant style of dress worn in "the olden time." There was also an old-fashioned ring which had

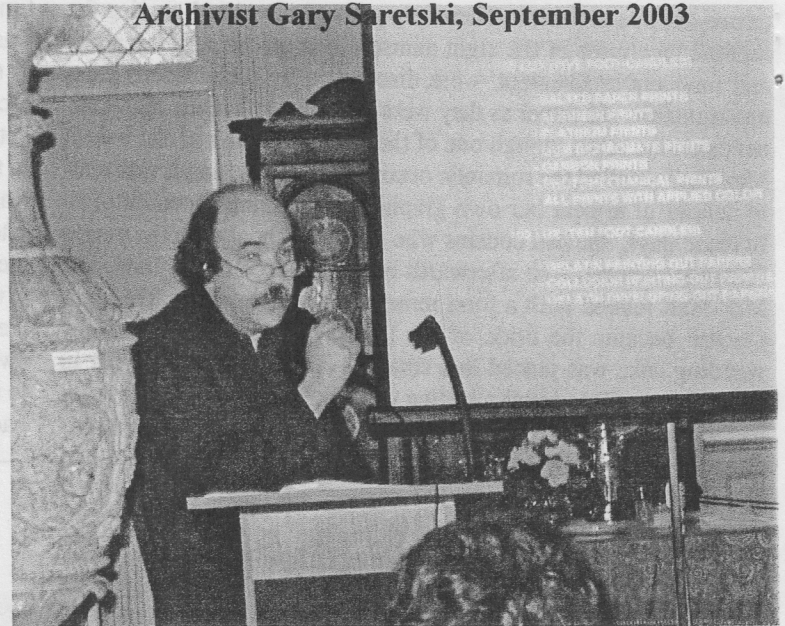
belonged to her grandmother and containing a lock of hair. In inscription on the inner circle of well-worn gold recorded that Ann Gannet died January 27th, 1826, aged 68 years. A small sample of beadwork sixty-five years old and which had been worked by Mrs. Hall was shown.

Perhaps the most curious relics in Mrs. Hall's possession were two excellent but soiled and faded examples of the embossed paper collars and cuffs once worn by ladies of style. One of these precious relics of adornment, of one hundred years ago, comprising one collar and one cuff, was presented to the writer's wife, who had kindly clipped off a fragment to accompany this little history.

At the age of seventy-six, Mrs. Hall could see to read without the aid of glasses. The photograph taken on the day of our visit illustrated this remarkably good eyesight and incidentally, her patriotism. Her dress is clasped with a coat-of-arms which had been worn in the Philippines by one of Uncle Sam's soldier boys, on whom she bestowed her warmest favor.

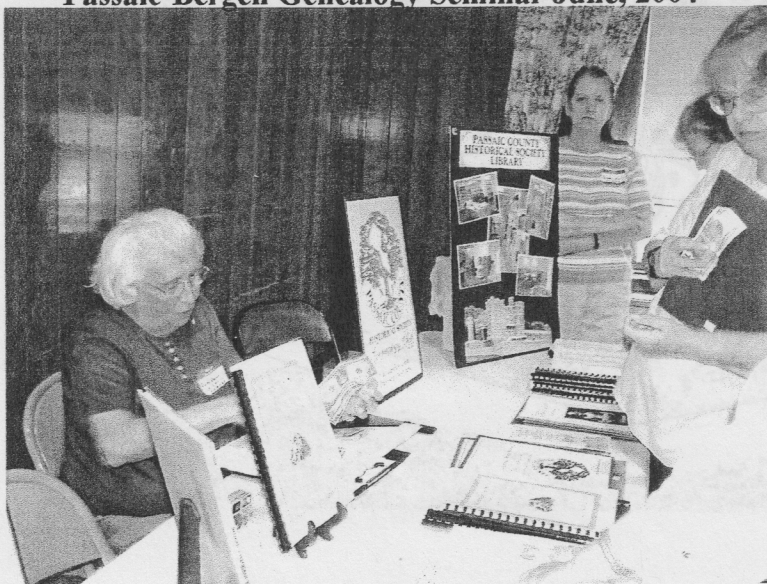
