Passaic County World War I Casualties

The assassination of Austrian Archduke Franz Ferdinand in Sarajevo on June 28, 1914, triggered World War I. Three years later, on April 6, 1917, the United States entered the war. Although the conflict ended the following year on November 11, 1918, it was a deadly and costly war during which 2.8 million men were inducted into the U. S. Armed Force.

More than 3,400 New Jersey men were killed in action or otherwise died while in service; 251 men were Passaic County residents.

In late 1919, the U.S. War Department issued, to the adjutant generals of each state, sample cards for the recording of service information for deceased soldiers and sailors.

The New Jersey Department of State, Division of Archives and Records Management created a free online database that includes 3,427 name entries, linked to an information card or photograph, or often both.

The information cards provide the following data: name; service number; race; residence; place and date of enlistment; place and date of birth; organizations served in and dates of assignment/transfer; date killed or otherwise died

(if not killed in action, cause of death); wounds or injuries received; and the name and address of the person notified of the death. The photographs included in the series measure 3.5"x5.5", and contain (usually) an oval-shaped, reproduced image (frequently from a military portrait).

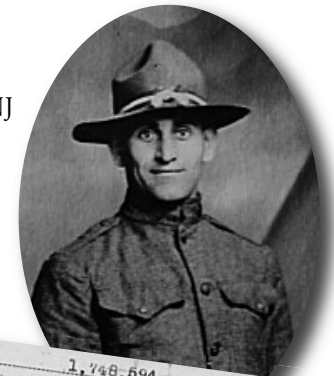

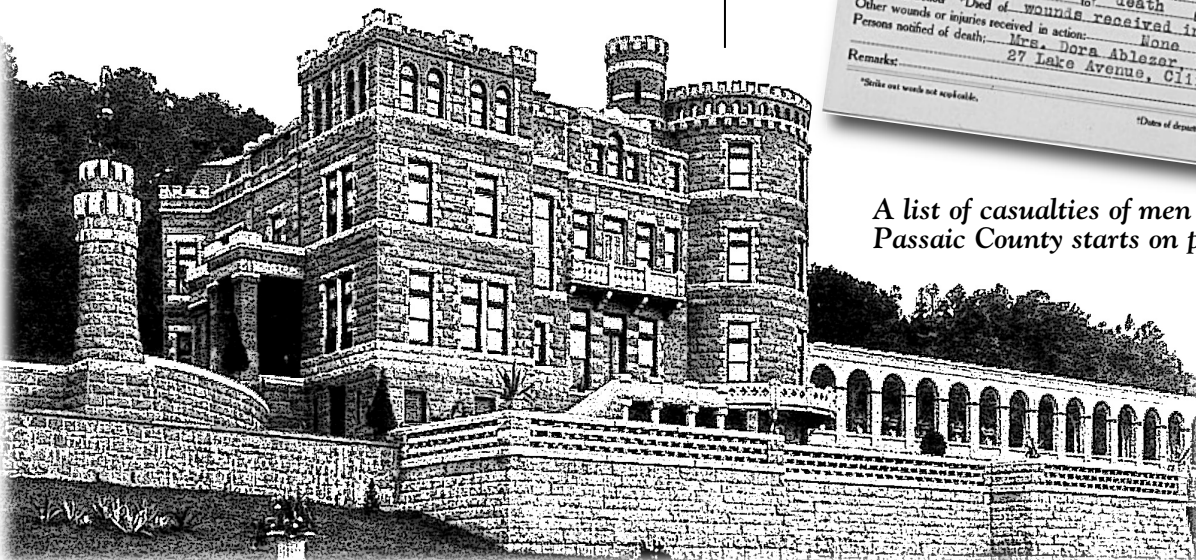

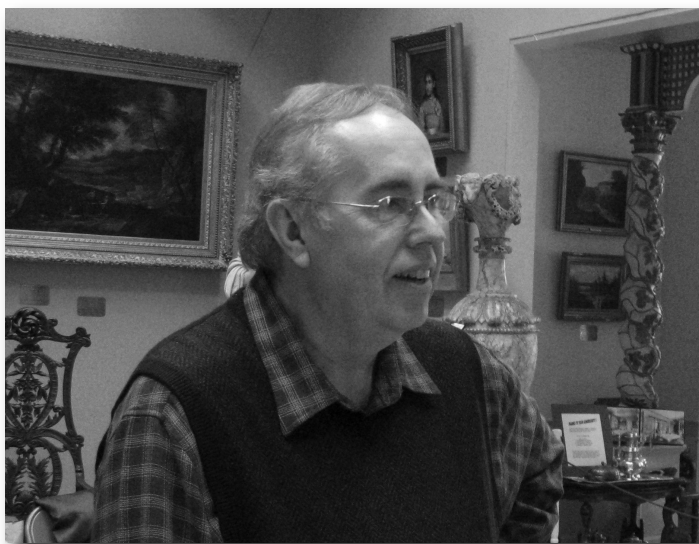
